Tom McCabe made a motion to pass the following resolution,
seconded by Margaret Swan. Vote 5-0, passed.
Whereas, the Town of Barre developed the budget for the Water
District No.9 project based an estimate for the Net Interest
Expense, and Whereas, the actual cost was higher than this
estimate, Be it resolved that the Town Board hereby authorizes
an increase of \$5,403.35 in the budget line for the Net Interest
Expense (from \$4,665.00 to \$10, 068.35), with a corresponding
decrease in the Contingency.

Covid-19 Employee Sick Days

Vote 5-0, passed.

COVA Update

Four towns in Orleans County have set up a committee to discuss the situation. They have met with COVA individuals, and are researching several options.

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County Approval of Zone Changes to Proposed Wind Law Changes
Councilwoman Kerri Richardson made a motion to not approve the
Orleans County Planning Board's recommendation on the Zone
changes to the Proposed Town of Barre Wind Law due to not
knowing which version of the proposed Wind Law was reviewed by
the Orleans County Planning Board; there was no second by the
Town Board. Motion failed.

RESOLUTION #14 County Planning Bd/Approval/Wind Law Changes Lynn Hill made a motion to approve the Orleans County Planning Board's recommendation on the Zone changes to the Proposed Town of Barre Wind Law, the motion was seconded by Margaret Swan. Vote 4-1, (Richardson)

Emergency Plan - Water

RESOLUTION #15 Town of Barre Emergency Water Plan Lynn Hill made a motion to accept the submission of the Town of Barre Emergency Plan by Highway Superintendent, Dale Brooks, seconded by Tom McCabe. Vote 5-0, passed.

Town of Barre Wind Law

The Town of Barre Town Board continued to review and discuss comments from residents and others submitted as part of the Public Hearing held on December 4, 2020 for the adoption of the proposed Local Law #1 of 2021, "to amend, repeal, and supplement the Wind Energy Law based on updated environmental protections and mitigation measures, evolving wind energy technology, infrastructure, and wind energy industry proposals".

SEOR Review/Wind Law

Councilwoman Kerri Richardson made a motion to adjourn the discussion of the SEQR review to another date due to the late hour, there was no seconded. Motion failed.

Councilwoman Kerri Richardson left the Town Board meeting at

10:15pm.

The Town Board reviewed and discussed Parts #2 and #3 of the SEQR review requirements for the proposed Wind Law changes. Town Board/Town of Barre February 10, 2021 Page 6

Lynn Hill made a motion to accept the review of parts #2 and #3
of the SEQR review, and declare a negative declaration. This is
an Unlisted Action under the State Environmental Quality Review
Act, however it was treated as a Type I Action for the propose
of environmental review. The motion was seconded by Tom McCabe.
Vote 4-0, passed.

Local Law #1 2021/Wind Law

RESOLUTION #16 Local Law/Wind Energy Conversion Systems Lynn Hill made a motion to approve the passing of the following Local Law, motion was seconded by Margaret Swan. Vote 3-1, (Supervisor Pogue abstains). Motion passed.

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Barre ("Town Board"), pursuant to Local Law No. 2 of 2008 (the "Wind Energy Law"), adopted Article XI of the Town of Barre Zoning Ordinance to allow the creation of Wind Energy Overlay Zones to regulate development of wind energy conversion projects in the Town of Barre (the "Town"); and WHEREAS, on October 14, 2020, the Town Board proposed Local Law No. 3 of 2020, which is now known as Local Law No. 1 of 2021 (the "Proposed Local Law") to amend, repeal, and supplement the Wind Energy Law based on updated environmental protections and mitigation measures, evolving wind energy technology, infrastructure, and wind energy industry proposals; and WHEREAS, the Proposed Local Law included revisions related to: Corrective actions for impacts to communication systems; Use of guy wires; Setback distances; Noise standards; Lighting standards; Maximum tip height; Shadow flicker; Acceptable construction hours; Decommissioning plans and related financial assurance; Agricultural protections; Use of environmental monitors to oversee compliance with approval requirement; and WHEREAS, the proposed revision to the Wind Energy Law is an Unlisted Action under the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"), and the regulations promulgated thereunder; and

WHEREAS, on October 14, 2020, the Town Board adopted a properly completed Part 1 of a Full SEQRA Environmental Assessment Form for the Proposed Local Law; and WHEREAS, on October 14, 2020, the Town Board asserted lead agency for purposes of SEQRA because the Town Board was the only involved agency

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RESOLUTION #16 Local Law/Wind Energy Conversion Systems (Con't) with authority to implement the proposed action, which was the adoption of the Proposed Local Law; and WHEREAS, on October 14, 2020, the Town Board referred the Proposed Local Law to the Town Planning Board for an advisory report pursuant to Section 350-5(C) of the Town Zoning Ordinance; and WHEREAS, on November 9, 2020, the Town Planning Board adopted a resolution adopting the minutes of the November 4, 2020 Town Planning Board meeting to pass on its recommendation to the Town Board regarding the Proposed Local Law; and WHEREAS, the Town Board has duly considered the comments on the Proposed Local Law made in the Town Planning Board November 4, 2020 meeting minutes at its December 1, 2020 workshop; and WHEREAS, a Notice of a Public Hearing on the Proposed Local Law was published in the Batavia Daily News

on November 17. 2020, and the Town Clerk also caused a copy of that Notice to be posted on the sign board of the Town maintained pursuant to Town Law §30(6) on November 13, 2020 and on the Town website (along with the proposed text of the Proposed Local Law) on November 19, 2020; and WHEREAS, a public hearing was duly held on the Proposed Local Law on December 4, 2020 at 6:00 p.m. before the Town Board at the Barre Town Hall via audio, video, and chat on the Town's You Tube channel and audio on the Town's telephone conference system, permitted by Executive Order 202.1, as extended, and all persons desiring to comment on the Proposed Local Law were heard or were provided the opportunity to submit written comments until 2020; and WHEREAS, on January 13, December 14, Proposed Local Law was referred to the Orleans County Planning Board for review pursuant to General Municipal Law § 239-m; and WHEREAS, by letter dated January 29, 2021, the Orleans County Planning Board recommended approval of the Proposed Local Law without revisions; and WHEREAS, based on the recommendation of the acoustical expert of the Town's environmental consultant,

LaBella Associates, Section 350-103(2)(a) of the Proposed Local Law, related to noise standards, was modified (the "Revised Proposed Local Law") to define the relevant time period for the "night" time period to be from 10:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. and that the "annual" element of the standard be eliminated to be more readily enforceable; and WHEREAS, no other revisions to the Proposed Local Law were made in response to comments from the public or the Town Planning Board; and WHEREAS, a draft Part 2 and Part 3 of a Full Environmental Assessment Form ("EAF"), with accompanying narrative,

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RESOLUTION #16 Local Law/Wind Energy Conversion Systems (Con't) was prepared for the Proposed Local Law, which the Town Board has reviewed; and WHEREAS, the environmental assessment reviews the potential adverse impacts associated with the proposed revisions to the Wind Energy Law, but does not, and is not required to, assess the potential adverse impacts of potential individual future projects to be considered under the revised Wind Energy Law because such projects would be individually subject to a full environmental review either pursuant to SEQRA or New York State renewable energy siting review processes; and WHEREAS, the Revised Proposed Local Law and draft EAF have been on the desks of all Town Board members since

February 3, 2021. NOW THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED, that the Town Board has considered the Revised Proposed Local Law and its potential for environmental impacts; reviewed and considered the EAF, the criteria contained in 6 N.Y.C.R.R. §617.7(c), and other identify the relevant supporting information to environmental concern; and thoroughly analyzed the identified relevant areas of environmental concern to determine if the Revised Proposed Local Law may have a significant adverse impact on the environment, and finds that the Revised Proposed Local Law would not have a significant impact on the environment because of the reasons discussed in the narrative to the EAF, which is incorporated in full herein and attached hereto, and the Revised Proposed Local Law: Is consistent with the general purposes stated in the Comprehensive Plan of the Town, to accommodate the necessary infrastructure for the provision of commercial wind powered electricity generation facilities so that they may be developed in a manner compatible with the general health, welfare and safety of the residents of the Town of Barre. Addresses the visual, aesthetic and the land use compatibility aspects of wind energy conversion systems; Encourages the location of wind energy conversion systems in areas where adverse impacts on the community are minimized. Encourages the co-location or shared use of proposed and existing wind energy conversion system sites. IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act, a Negative Declaration shall be made and duly filed, and an environmental impact statement need not be prepared; and it is RESOLVED that, pursuant to the Municipal Home Rule Law, proposed Local Law No. 1 of 2021 is hereby enacted, and shall be filed with the Secretary of State.
